All clothing must be worn as intended to be worn.


Only one pair of trousers to be worn at any one time.


Hats, scarves and gloves must be removed when in the hall (unless religious headwear).

Boots are authorised, however must be below the knee.

No low cut tops.

No football slogan clothing.

No headwear of any sort (unless appropriate headwear worn for religious purposes).

No sunglasses.

No flourescent tops.

No ripped or damaged clothing.

No hooded tops.

No steel toe cap footwear, football boots or similar footwear.

No flip-flops, sliders or heelies.

No clothing bearing slogans that are deemed racist, insulting or derogatory.

No jackets or open fronted tops, this includes cardigans and full front zippered tops.

No clothing that represents a gang or gang affiliation.


