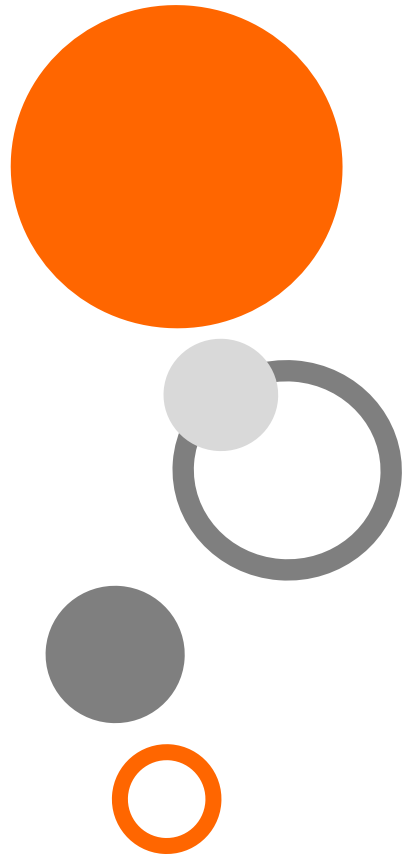
POPS: Who are we?

The visitor centre is open 12 – 5pm every day apart from Tuesday when it is closed.

How to book a visit

As a family member you can book your first visit by ringing the booking line at HMP/YOI Hindley on 01942 663 492 / 01942 663 234 (Monday to Friday, 9:00 – 12:00 and 13:00 – 15:00). The prisoner is allowed up to 3 visitors over the age of ten and 3 under ten years old. Sentenced prisoners receive a minimum of 2 visits per 28 day period (up to 5 based on status).

To book a visit online you will need:

- the prisoner's number
- the prisoner's date of birth
- the dates of birth for all visitors coming with you
- to make sure the person you're visiting has added you to their visitor list

Your visit will be confirmed by email within 3 working days of making your request. If you've made an online visit booking request and haven't received a confirmation email within 1-3 working days, email socialvisits.hindley@hmps.gsi.gov.uk.

Please be aware that you need to be over the age of 18 to visit a prisoner. If a child is visiting then they need to be accompanied by an adult. In exceptional cases prison governors do have the discretion to allow children aged 16-18 years to visit without an accompanying adult but only with parental consent.

What to bring with you

Identification

You will need to bring one of the following forms of identification with you:

- Passport (including foreign passport) and time expired passports where the photograph is still recognisable.
- Foreign national identity card.
- EC ID cards.
- Photographic Driving license.
- Senior citizen's public transport pass issued by the local authority.
- Employer's or student ID card – must clearly show the name of the visitor and the employer or educational establishment and has photograph or signature which can be compared with the visitor's appearance/signature.
- Photographic disabled parking badges.
- Red Maternity Book (ID option for children).
- Birth certificate for children under 16.

Money

You can send money using your debit card or by bank transfer:

1. Make sure you have their prisoner number & date of birth
2. Go to this web page: www.gov.uk/send-prisoner-money and complete the online form.
3. Money should reach the prisoner in 1-3 working days.

Money can also be sent in by postal order, but only in pre-approved circumstances. Please speak to a member of POPS' staff if you are unable to access the online service.

Property

Property can only be handed in by family or friends if a prisoner arrives at HMYOI Hindley within 28 days of being sentenced.

The prisoner must have submitted an application for property and had it authorised by a governor.

In general prisoners place orders for property themselves via application forms on their wing.

How to get there

Bus: From Wigan town centre get the number 9 bus that goes to Leigh Town centre but stops at the top of Gibson Street.

Train: The nearest station is Wigan Wallgate or Wigan North Western which is 15 mins bus ride from the prison.

Car: FROM THE SOUTH: M602, via A580, Leigh turn off right onto A579. At large roundabout take left onto A578. At mini roundabout take 3rd exit onto Wigan Road. At traffic lights turn left onto Bickershaw Lane, continue 1 ½ miles the prison is signposted on the right.

FROM THE NORTH : M6 VIA M61, Leave M61 at Westhoughton junction onto A58. Turn left off the A58 onto lower Leigh Road. At lights turn right onto Atherton Road. At the next lights turn left onto Leigh Road. At the next lights turn right onto Bickershaw lane continue 1 ½ miles. The prison is signposted on the right.

When you arrive

Please arrive 30 mins before your visit time. Car parking is adjacent to the Visitor Centre Building. All visitors should go to the Visitor Centre to book in. In the centre visitors can access toilets/baby changing facilities and lockers to store your personal possessions.

There are currently no disabled toilets within the Visitor Centre and there is no access ramp. The entrance to the Visitor Centre has a small lip to navigate. Prison-issue wheelchairs are available at the Visitor Centre.

Entering the Prison

All visitors are required to have valid identification to enter the prison and have this on their person at all times. Visitors will be searched upon entering the prison. If searched, children will be patted down by a female member of staff in front of their parent/carer. All visitors' religious beliefs are respected so if a search is required those wearing religious headgear will be taken aside to ensure privacy.

There may also be passive drug dogs present during the search procedure.

All visitors should dress appropriately and be aware of the prison's dress code which includes tight or revealing clothing and no clothing bearing slogans.

Visitors may only take with them their ID and up to £40 per visiting group (please ensure that at least £10 of this allowance is in coins. £5 and £10 notes are accepted but not £20 notes). An additional £5 per prisoner can be taken in to purchase a goody bag for your loved one to take back with them after your visit. Goody bags can be purchased from 3pm onwards and come pre-bagged with 6 items included (2x chocolate, 2x cans, 2x crisps). Men on a basic regime are not able to have a goody bag. Men on standard regime are allowed one bag and those on enhanced are allowed up to two bags.

Children

Prams are not allowed into the prison but may be left at the Visitor Centre. A transparent feeding bottle containing milk, a spare nappy and a handful of wipes, removed from their packet, can be taken into the visits hall. All items must be placed in clear bags provided by the prison. Access to baby change is available.

In the Visits Hall

Visitors can purchase hot and cold drinks, snacks and sweets from the tea bar during their visit. A play area is available for children aged 3-8 years old. This area is supervised by POPS' staff but parent/carers are responsible for their children at all times.

There is a small play area for children. Toilets are accessible but it is advised wherever possible that visitors use the toilets prior to their visit. Visitors leaving the visits hall to access the toilets will be searched again prior to returning to the visits hall.

Accessibility

There are disabled parking spaces immediately in front of the Visitor Centre. A ramp leads up to the main prison gate. The Visits Hall is accessible by lift. Disabled toilets are accessible within the prison by lift. Wheelchairs and walking aids are allowed into the prison but may be subject to security.

To send a prisoner a letter, please write his name and number on the front of the envelope and a return name and address on the back in case there are issues with him receiving the letter and/or it needs to be returned.

More Support...

Financial Assistance with Visiting: If you qualify to receive help with your finances such as benefits, you may be able to recoup all or part of the cost of your travel expenses through the Assisted Prison Visits Scheme. As part of your application you will need to get a secondary form stamped by prison staff in order to prove your visit took place. You can request a copy of this form at the visitor centre. If you have any problems with accessing this service, the visitor centre staff will be happy to assist you.
